Code of Practice for Young People

Burnham Tennis Association is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well-being of all its members. The Club believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents associated with the Club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others. Therefore, junior members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the Club with Sue Gray, the Membership Secretary, a Tennis Assistant and Junior Organiser.

As a junior member of Burnham Tennis Association, you are expected to abide by the following code of practice:

- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of age, gender, ability, race, cultural background, religious beliefs or sexual identity.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions, or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit for training and match sessions, as agreed with the Coach.
- Members must pay any fees for training or events promptly.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke on Club premises or whilst representing the Club at competitions.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the Club premises or whilst representing the Club.

If, as a junior member of Burnham Tennis Association, you plan to take part in a tennis activity organised by the Club, whether at our home ground or 'away', you need to make sure that your Parent or Guardian has completed one or both of the following forms, if relevant:
